EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 12, series of 2020

**AN EXECUTIVE ORDER LIFTING THE MUNICIPALITY OF NAGA'S
GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE AND PLACING THE SAID
MUNICIPALITY IN MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE IN
ACCORD WITH THE NATIONAL GUIDELINES ISSUED BY INTER-AGENCY
TASK FORCE ADOPTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES**

WHEREAS, the President of the Philippines on April 30, 2020, has issued Executive Order No. 112 allowing any amendment or modification of such Omnibus Guidelines on the implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines as may be approved by the Inter-agency Task Force (IATF) without need of further approval of the President;

WHEREAS, the IATF, based on its risk assessment, classified REGION IX – ZAMBOANGA SIBUGAY on the 29th of May 2020 as a low-risk province and placed such under Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ) from June 01, 2020 until June 15, 2020 under its Resolution No. 41, series of 2020;

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Naga, Zamboanga Sibugay, by virtue of Section 4 (g) of Republic Act 11469 otherwise known as the Bayanihan to Heal as One Act provides that all Local Government Units (LGUs) should act within the letter and spirit of all rules, regulations and directives issued by the National Government and are fully cooperating towards a unified, cohesive and orderly implementation of the national policy to address COVID-19, is hereby adopting the Resolution No. 40, series of 2020, of the IATF and is hereby placing the entire Municipality of Naga, Zamboanga Sibugay under Modified General Community Quarantine;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RINO O. DELOS REYES, Municipal Mayor of Naga, Zamboanga Sibugay, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE, GUIDELINES. The entire municipality is now under Modified General Community Quarantine but subject to the following guidelines:

1. All persons may now go outside their residences but subject to the following:

- a. No one shall be allowed to go out of their residences without a face mask or other protective gear which will prevent the further spread of COVID-19;
 - b. Social and Physical distancing shall be observed and must be strictly implemented at all times and in all places;
 - c. Curfew hours previously issued shall remain valid and effective;
2. Indoor and outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of exercises such as but not limited to walking, jogging, running, biking, golf, swimming, tennis, badminton, equestrian, and skateboarding are allowed subject to the conditions under paragraph 1 above and no sharing of equipment where applicable;
 3. Mass gatherings shall now be allowed, provided, that participants shall be limited to fifty percent (50%) of the venue or seating capacity;
 4. Face-to-face or in-person classes may be conducted in Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs), provided, there is strict compliance with minimum public health standards, consultation with local government units, and compliance with guidelines set by the Commission of Higher Education (CHED). HEI activities that involve mass gathering of students shall continue to be prohibited;
 5. Work in all public and private offices may be allowed to resume physical reporting to work at full operating capacity, with alternative work arrangements for persons who are sixty (60) years old and above, those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risks, and pregnant women; and
 6. In all public transports, a strict one (1) meter distance between passengers shall be observed.
 7. Travels mainly for leisure shall not be permitted.

SECTION 2. INTERZONAL AND INTRAZONAL MOVEMENT, GUIDELINES.

1. The movement of all types of cargoes by land, air, or sea shall be unhampered;
2. Workers in the logistics sector, such as cargo, trucking, courier delivery and port operations shall likewise be allowed, provided, that only a maximum of five (5) personnel may operate cargo and delivery vehicles by land, with or without load and strict social distancing shall be observed;
3. Land, air, or sea travel by uniformed personnel, government officials and employees for official business with the corresponding travel authority, those transporting medical supplies and laboratory specimens related to COVID-19, and other relief and humanitarian assistance, shall be allowed;

SECTION 3. PROHIBITED ACTS. No acts of discrimination shall be inflicted upon healthcare workers, repatriated OFWs and non-OFWs, COVID-19 cases, whether confirmed, recovered or undergoing treatment, as well as suspect and probable cases. Any acts of discrimination shall be dealt with criminally, civilly, and/or administratively.

SECTION 4. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any part, section, or provision herein is held invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVITY. This order shall be effective from June 1 to June 15, 2020.
